CKDT: Who are we?

Central Kentucky Dance Theatre is Lexington's first community based ballet company. Meaning, our dancers can dance at any studio in the area and audition for our productions. At this time our dancers come from: Central Kentucky Ballet Conservatory, Gotta Dance Studios, Lexington Ballet, LDF Ballet Academy, Kentucky Dance Academy, Dance Attack, Dancers Studio, and SCAPA. CKDT hopes to always bring dancers in the community together to create and dance together.



Tony Oates Guest Artist

Anthony Oates, a Richmond, VA native, began dancing at the age of eight. He received his ballet training from the School of Richmond Ballet, under the direction of Igor Antonov, Malcolm Burn, and Arnott Mader. Mr. Oates attended summer intensive study at Boston Ballet in 2013, and at age sixteen, he was offered a traineeship with Richmond Ballet.



At eighteen, he became a member of Richmond Ballet II, performing a variety of New Works, full length story ballets, as well as Richmond Ballet's touring outreach program for elementary school students. Anthony danced with Richmond Ballet II for two seasons before joining the Professional Company in 2015, where he danced for three seasons.

During his five seasons with the Richmond Ballet, Mr. Oates had the pleasure of working with choreographers: William Soleau, Val Caniparoli, Starr Foster, and Philip Neal. He originated roles in New Works by Ma Cong, and Katarzyna Skarpetowska, which he performed on tour at The Joyce Theater and at New York Live Arts in New York City. Favorite career performances include George Balanchine's Theme & Variations, Salvatore Aiello's Journey, Black Swan pas de deux in Malcolm Burn's Swan Lake, and Grande Pas de Deux in Stoner Winslett's The Nutcracker.

Anthony has also appeared in the Ballet West National Choreographic Festival in Salt Lake City, and was featured as Snowboy in Virginia Repertory Theatre's West Side Story in 2018. Most recently, Mr. Oates appeared in Ballet Memphis' 2023 production of Cinderella.

Mr. Oates received a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Graphic Design from the Savannah College of Art & Design (SCAD) in August, 2022.



Miranda Maas Dancing Aurora

Miranda Maas was born and raised in Lexington, Kentucky. Miss Maas started ballet at the age of 13 at a local competition studio, Lexington Dance Factory, under the teachings of Leah Copley Summers.

At the age of 16 Miss Maas began studying ballet full time at Gloria Deo School of the Arts under the direction of Sarah Henderson. Miss Maas was accepted into Cary Ballet Conservatory in Cary, NC where she did one year post high school training under the direction of Mariaelena Ruiz. Miss Maas was a member of the conservatory's pre-professional company, Cary Ballet Company. As a student, Miss

Maas participated in Youth America Grand Prix multiple years, performing classical variations such as Lilac Fairy, Don Quixote's Cupid, and Odette from Swan Lake. As a student, Miss Maas performed in the Nutcracker and had lead roles in The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe.

Miss Maas joined United Ballet Theatre, under the direction of Joseph Gatti, as a trainee for their 2021-22 season. Miss Maas also danced with Kentucky Ballet Theatre under the direction of Norbe Risco as a student trainee for their 2022-23 season.

Sylvia Quinio Dancing Lilac Fairy

Sylvia Quinio is a dancer with the University of Cincinnati: College Conservatory of Music (CCM) getting her BFA in Ballet Performance. Originally from Lexington, KV, she began dancing at Dance Attack Dance Company with Mindy Stone in 2016 at the age of eleven in competitive dance. A couple years later she started ballet lessons at Dancers Studio with Laurie Fields which led her to audition for the School for Creative and Performing Arts (SCAPA) for high school where she majored in ballet for all four years.



During her junior year of high school, she joined Kentucky Ballet Theatre's ballet academy for the 2021-2022 season, performing in The Nutcracker and Beauty and the Beast. In her senior year of high school, she began lessons with Leah Copley-Summers performing with Solo's For Six at the Mid-Atlantic Dance Initiative (MADI) in the Summer of 2023, receiving the MADI Award for the top performance of the weekend. Now, she mainly focuses on ballet, modern and contemporary styles of dance, training five days a week at CCM. November 30th through December 2nd, she will be performing in the Danceworks Concert as the understudy of Lise in Peter Davidson's American and Paris and a soloist in a contemporary piece by Shauna Steele.
