Central Kentucky Ballet ConservatoryRequirements, Schedule and Tuition

Level 1 (ages 6-7) Dancers are required to take 1 class a week but are encouraged to take a second class in either ballet, jazz or conditioning from any program in the area. Gotta Dance does offer these classes. (sign up through Gotta Dance Studio) Level 1: Saturday 10:45-11;15 Conservatory Rehearsal: Monthly \$30 Costume Fee: \$80 Performance Fee: \$75 Yearly Due September 15th

Level 2 (ages 8-9) Dancers are required to take 2 classes a week. Dancers may take their 2nd class from any ballet studio in the area. Gotta Dance does offer this level. Level 2: Friday 4:00-5:00 Conservatory Technique and Rehearsal \$60 Monthly Costume Fee: \$80 Per Costume Performance Fee: \$200 Yearly Due September 15th

Level 3 (ages 10-12) Dancers are required to take 3 classes a week. Dancers may take their 3rd class from any ballet studio in the area. Gotta Dance does offer this level. Level 3: Friday 6:30-8:30 and/or Sunday 12:30-2:00. Conservatory Technique and Rehearsal Monthly Fee \$70 or \$80 Costume Fee \$80 Per Costume Performance Fee: \$300 Yearly Due September 15th

Level 4 (ages 12 and up) Dancers are required to take 4 classes a week. Dancers may take their 4th class from any ballet studio in the area. Gotta Dance does offer this level. Level 4 Friday 5:00-6:30 Saturday 12:15-2:15

Monthly Fee: \$110 Performance Fee \$300 Yearly Due September 15th

Level 5 Dancers are required to take 5 classes a week. Dancers may take 2 classes from any ballet program in the area. Level 5 Friday 5:00-6:30 Conservatory Technique Saturday 2:15-3:45 Conservatory Technique Sunday 2:00-3:30 Monthly Fee: \$120 Costume Fee: \$80 Per Costume Performance Fee \$300 Yearly Due September 15th

Behavior

CKBC believes in kindness!!! We will be a small program made up of hard working dancers, positive teachers, and parents!! Any of the listed behaviors from a student or parent can result in immediate dismissal: foul language, gossip, negative or confrontational behavior, excessive talking in class or the lobby area, or online (including social media). Any behavior deemed inappropriate from a dancer or parent by myself or anyone on the CKBC Staff or director could be grounds for immediate dismissal. Please treat the studio as your home and be kind and respectful of all Involved!!!

Medical Information

Entrance and Exit Rules

All dancers under 12 must be dropped off and picked up in the Gotta Dance Lobby area. Dancers over 12 may be picked up at the door but will not be excused to go downstairs until they receive a text that their parent is at the door downstairs.

Withdrawal from Classes

You may withdraw from any or all classes with a written note by the 15th of the month. Failure to do so will result in payment of any remaining balance.

Central Kentucky Ballet Conservatory What is a ballet conservatory?

A ballet conservatory is a progressive ballet program that is based on a specific curriculum of goals that are evaluated each year. The conservatory is a program that offers students the training they need to safely develop to their highest level in ballet and eventually pointe. Students in this program will not only reach their highest potential in ballet but in all genres of dance they focus on since ballet technique serves as the base of all other forms of dance. To sum up, if your dancer aspires to be the best they can be, the conservatory is the place for your dancer!!!

What are the class requirements for the conservatory program?

The conservatory program is both developmentally appropriate as well as ambitious. Our program will begin with 4 levels with the following requirements: Level 1 (our youngest students approximate ages 6-7) 1 technique class and 1 rehearsal class Level 2 (approximate age 8-9) 1 technique class and 1 rehearsal class Level 3 (approximate age 10 and up) 2 technique classes and 1 rehearsal class. Level 4 (approximate age 13 and up) 3 technique classes and 1 rehearsal class

***** Levels 2-4 are required to take our 5 weeks of summer classes

What are the "perks" of being a part of the conservatory?

Students in the Program will develop a solid ballet technique that can only be molded and developed through consistent and intense training. Students will be able to progress on to advanced pointe. Students in the conservatory will have an automatic membership to our new community dance company "The Central Kentucky Dance Theatre" that will be housed at Gotta Dance. The company will have a full season of performances as well as master classes, festivals and competitions. Students in the conservatory will advance to a level that will qualify them for such unique opportunities as admittance to SCAPA, Kentucky Governor's School for the Arts, Summer Intensives such as Louisville Ballet, Cincinnati Ballet etc. If a student desires to pursue dance in college or even look into a professional career they will have the training to pursue these dreams also. In summary, the conservatory will train your dancer to their highest

potential in ballet as well as any other form of dance they pursue.

What is the Dress Code for the Conservatory?

Girls: Black Leotard, pink tights and pink ballet shoes.

Hair must be worn in a bun with bobby pins and a hair net.

- No jewelry or warmups, skirts are allowed during center work.

- Girls should purchase a nude leotard to wear under costumes during performances

- Girls may wear a black sports bras under uniform leotards

Boys: Black or White T-Shirt (tucked in) with black tights, shorts or pants and white socks and shoes

What is the attendance policy of the conservatory?

Dancers must attend all of their classes and rehearsals. If your dancer needs to miss please email me at leahcply@yahoo.com . Excused absences are the following: sickness, family emergencies, graded school events, large social events e.g. proms weddings.

What is Ballet Etiquette?

Ballet etiquette is a list of good habits that dancers not just in ballet should utilize to develop their technique properly. Students will be given a list on their first day of these habits and we will practice these habits in class as much as we do technique. Parents, you will love this part of ballet, because it is simply habits that bring out the very best in your dancer as a dancer and as a person!!

What are skills tests and ballet exams?

I am a great believer that students need clear goals when they dance...just like learning anything else. I love to give the students a list of skills we will cover in class and set up periodic testing on these skills. With the younger students we will test weekly and at the end of each 6 weeks any skill your dancer does not pass they may take again. With older dancers we will do a skills test every 6 weeks. At the end of the semester any skill your dancer does not pass and may be tested again at the end of the semester. Dancers should only have to practice around a half hour a week on their own to pass these skills tests, if your dancer is struggling we will meet and set up a great plan for them. Dancers will also have 2 yearly written exams on concepts and vocabulary. I want you as a parent to always know how your dancer is doing and what we can do to keep them Progressing!

Audition Season: Summer Intensives, SCAPA, and GSA

Students at CKBC are encouraged to audition for summer intensive programs across the U.S. Dancers age 12 and up may audition for prestigious intensive summer programs during the months of January and February. We love to see our dancers reach out for the best in dance. I will be available to help guide you in summer decision making, audition videos and pictures. We also encourage our students to audition for the School of Creative and Performing Arts as well as the Governor's School for the Arts. CKBC makes educational opportunities a priority in our preparation of students. Students will receive everything they need to give their best audition.

Summer Study

Dancers in the conservatory are expected to attend our 6 week summer session. We encourage our students to study as much as possible during the summer. Most students study as much as they can in the summer because this is when dancers can grow the most. Both dancers and teachers are not overwhelmed by school, choreography, performances etc.Therefore most students make great technical strides in the summer.

Alumni Students

CKBC students are ALWAYS CKBC students. CKBC, like other serious pre-professional-professional programs, does not believe that dancing stops after high school. We encourage our dancers to come back and dance with our company and take class as often as their life allows. We believe that dance can be a lifelong endeavor for dancers. Whether it is an artistic passion, career or simply your fitness of choice we support all dancers that choose to continue dancing in both our conservatory and Company.

Pointe Readiness

Dancers will be invited by the director into the pre-pointe program where they will spend (usually) 6 months to a year in preparation. Dancers must be 11.5 years old to go onto pointe.Dancers will complete both in class and home exercises (and be tested) as well as be evaluated by a physical therapist before going onto pointe.

Competition Solo/Duet and Trio

Dancers may work privately and perform a ballet solo/duet or trio in any ballet or commercial style competition. To prepare for a competition a dancer will prepare 10 weeks before a competition a half hour per week. This preparation will begin at the beginning of 2nd semester. Detailed information about solos will go out before the spring semester.

Conditioning

One of the most important aspects of training in dance is having a consistent conditioning program. Please make sure your dancer is taking advantage of our conditioning classes and/or contemporary and jazz classes located in our studio or the studio of your choice. These classes are essential in keeping a dancer physically safe and healthy.

CKBC automatic membership to Central Kentucky Dance Theatre

Dancers in the Conservatory also become members of the CKDT. Please see our website for your yearly fee. We expect our conservatory dancers to participate in our full season of performances. The conservatory will accept non-performing students in our technique classes if there is space in the class, but full time performing members will always have priority registration.

What is the Central Kentucky Dance Theatre?

CKDT is a community based regional dance company. Meaning students from any program in the Lexington area may join the company and be a part of our performances. Dancers in the company simply must be studying ballet in a conservatory or academy program and maintain good attendance. CKDT is an opportunity to have a performance season that encompasses all forms of performances:main stage, community and festival performances as well as competitions.

What Kind of time commitment will CKDT require?

Each performance will require 10 weeks of rehearsals on a Friday, Saturday or Sunday. Dancers may miss 2 rehearsals and still maintain their place in the company and the performance. Dancers will sign a contract for each performance with all rehearsals dates and performance dates listed so that each dancer knows the time commitment.

What kind of dancers are we looking for in our productions?

Though some of our productions will encompass different styles of dance CKDT members need to be in an academy or multiclass ballet program. Dancers ages 7-9 need to be studying at least 2 days a week. Dancers ages 10-12 need to study at least 3 times a week. Dancers 13 and up need to be studying at least 4 times a week.

How do I become a member of the Central Kentucky Dance Theatre?

Dancers interested in the company simply need to audition for one of our performances and pass the audition. Dancers pay a performance fee (see website: centralkyballetconservatory.com) as well as costume fees.

What if my dancer misses too many rehearsals or does not meet technique requirements?

If your dancer has too many absences, they may be pulled from the production. If it is better for the other dancers, your dancer will need to pay for private lessons and " catch up" with their choreography. Your dancer will not be eligible for CKDT's next production.

What if my dancer changes their mind after auditions?

Dancers that drop out after auditions will not be eligible to audition for CKDT's next performance. If this happens more than once they will not be eligible to dance with CKDT. It is important to us to teach our dancers that a contract is your word and your word is important. If dancers are dropping after an audition, they may be dropping because they were not happy with their part. CKDT will never support this manner of thinking because students will not have a future in dance (any future endeavors) in any way if this is the outlook they take in audition settings.

What if I am a conservatory member and I cannot participate in a production?

Please tell Ms. Leah before auditions for the performance to be excused from a Production.

Will my dancer be able to be committed to a full time academy program and still be a part of CKDT?

Absolutely!! CKDT is a community based company that simply offers extra performances for serious dancers in Lexington and the surrounding area. Dancers need to make sure they do not have time conflicts with their home program.

What will CKDT be performing for their 24-25 Season?

The Central Kentucky Dance Theatre will have 2 main stage productions as well as opportunities to attend the Mid-Atlantic Dance Festival and Competitions.

About the Director

Leah Copley Summers has taught ballet for the past 33 years. Leah studied with Dr. Mary Marcuzzi along with many others as she attended pre-professional programs. Leah graduated Cum Laude with her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Elementary Education at Marshall University in 1991. After receiving her degree, Leah began her career as a ballet teacher, choreographer, and artistic director, with the River Cities Dance Company. She served as director for thirteen years working with both Marshall University and Shawnee State University to provide arts to the area community. Leah also worked as adjunct faculty at Marshall University and served on the faculty of the WV Governor's School for the Arts during her time in the Tri-state area. After moving to Cary, North Carolina Leah continued her career with the Cary Ballet Conservatory for 8 years where she worked as full-time faculty creating original story ballets and concert pieces. Moving to Lexington, KY Leah worked with the Bluegrass Youth Ballet and later became the founding director of the LDF Ballet Academy. Leah's greatest achievement has been the success of her students. Leah's students have gone on to study at prestigious arts school and continued on to careers as professional dancers, teachers and choreographers.

Through my 33 years of teaching I have served as both a teacher and a director. All students

are raised by a village of teachers, but any time a teacher or director spends more than two years with a student their teaching certainly impacts the future of the student. I have often not
